AFFIDAVIT

Of

Professor James E. Starrs

James E. Starrs, a Professor at The George Washington University, Washington, D.C. 20052, being duly sworn, does depose, affirm and say that I have been asked by Chaolette Kahler-Traylor to provide this affidavit in support of her efforts to exhume and analyze the remains of her husband Thomas R. Traylor and in support thereof state that

- 1. I am a fully tenured Professor of Forensic Sciences in the Department of Forensic Sciences of the Columbian College of Arts & Sciences at The George Washington University, Washington, D.C.;
- 2. In addition to the above full-time position, I also hold a full-time position as a fully tenured Professor of Law on the faculty of the Law School at The George Washington University, Washington, D.C.;
- 3. Among my teaching responsibilities for the past forty years of teaching I have taught courses in the forensic sciences, including subjects such as forensic pathology, forensic anthropology and firearms examinations.
- 4. I am the co-author of the 4th edition of <u>Scientific Evidence in Civil and Criminal Cases</u>, Foundation Press, 1995, having authored the chapters, among others, in that one volume text on forensic pathology, forensic anthropology and firearms examinations.
- 5. I am a Distinguished Fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences and have been elected to serve two three year terms on its Board of Directors. I also served for fifteen years on the Board of Editors of the curnal of Forensic Sciences.
- 6. I have written over 100 articles, many in the field of forensic science and I have co-edited the Scientific Sleuthing Review for the past 25 years.
- 7. Over the past fifteen years I have organized and supervised the exhumation and analysis or reanalysis of the remains of nineteen persons, many of whom died under suspicious circumstances, a number of them as firearms fatalities. Among the persons whose remains I have exhumed are Jesse James, Albert DeSalvo (the alleged Boston Strangler), Mary Sullivan (the last victim of the so-called Boston Stranger), the five victims of Alfred Packer (known as the Colorado cannibal) and Carl Weiss, M.D. (the alleged assassin of Senator Huey Long) among others.
