Your letter has been received by The NAACP Legal Department. We apologize for the delay in responding to your letter regarding your request for assistance for Major Clarence Anderson III.

Regrettably we are unable to accept his case. Due to our current staffing, caseload and prior commitments, we limit our involvement typically to class action cases involving at least ten parties or more. The NAACP specifically handles civil rights cases within our six substantive game changers.
