

Good afternoon,

I am writing to provide notification that FAP case #20220058 that met criteria for child physical abuse was CLOSED on 22 JUL 25. You were identified as the non-offending parent in this case.

I have requested an official memo and will provide that upon receipt but want you to know soonest of the case disposition.

I shared your desire to keep the case open for case management services and pending outcome of upcoming protective order hearings; however, the Clinical Case Staffing Meeting (CCSM) Chair determined your family has reached maximum benefit for FAP services.

Subject: FAP Case Closure

Good afternoon,

I was taken aback by your email. Based on our previous conversations, I was reassured FAP would remain involved until ALL my court cases had been resolved.

Since the service member is still on active-duty and there are on-going critical safety concerns that need to be addressed, including but not limited to my military protective order that is synchronized to reflect my civilian protective order.

In 2022, I was promised by the Commanding General, Garrison Commander, NGB Commander and Congressman's Office that FAP would remain involved until the service member was separated or no longer had UCMJ authority.

After I came to Fort Myer and reported to your office in Aug 2022, that the Command lied about securing the very weapons the active-duty service member threatened to kill us with, and yet, the weapons remained in my house.

To this day, those weapons have yet to be secured, and CID swept the entire matter under the rug this whole time.

I have an upcoming protective order hearing in two weeks in the State of Virginia, requiring me to fly me and my family to attend yet another court hearing with the active-duty service member who was recently convicted of a felony at a general court martial.
